TEAMWORKS (Virtual)

Contest Description

The purpose of this contest is to evaluate each team's preparation for employment and to recognize outstanding students for excellence and professionalism in the field of construction. The team will be required to present a live virtual presentation with industry professionals. This presentation will follow the national technical standards for a TeamWorks presentation (see below).

Knowledge Performance

The contest will not include a knowledge exam.

Students will receive the project plans electronically by February 6, 2021. Students should be ready to present at their scheduled time. The schedule and times will be emailed to the advisor/contestants by Friday, December 11, 2020. Changes cannot be made to scheduled time slots. Resumes must be submitted to SkillsUSA California (details to follow).

Skill Performance

Students in this competition will be scheduled for live interviews over the Zoom platform on **February 20, 2021**. Students should be ready to interview at their scheduled time. The interview will focus on convincing the employer to hire the student as well as a description of basic masonry processes The contestant schedule will be emailed to the advisor/contestants by Friday, December 11, 2020.

- 1.2.4 Use of visuals is required. A PowerPoint presentation or other presentation software can be used.
- 1.2.5 All team members must participate in the presentation.
