

2020 State Contest

PIN DESIGN

Description

Contestants are to present their artwork for the pin design and give a 5-7 minute presentation explaining how their design accurately represents the state, what qualities it possesses and why another SkillsUSA member would want to wear it. Contestants are encouraged to use visual aids such as PowerPoint or notebooks.

Presentation points should include:

- How the contestant came up with the concept
- The process in which the contestant designed the pin
- Why the contestant feels it represents their state
- What its unique qualities are
- Why the pin would be desirable to wear, collect, or trade at NLSC

Displays will be judged on:

- Neatness
- Overall aesthetic appeal
- Informative/educational value
- Cohesiveness
- Grammar/spelling
- Size
- Originality and creativity
- Overall effort

Clothing Requirements

All contestants are required to be in the official dress of SkillsUSA: Class A - SkillsUSA Formal Attire

Official Attire for Men:

- Red SkillsUSA blazer, windbreaker, or sweater
- White dress shirt
- Plain solid black tie
- Black dress slacks
- Black dress shoes

Official Attire for Women:

- Red SkillsUSA blazer, windbreaker, or sweater
- White collarless or small-collared blouse or white turtleneck (Collar must not extend over the blazer lapel or the sweater or windbreaker)
- Black dress skirt (knee-length) or black dress slacks
- Black shoes

- 3. Rendering of Pin: all entries should be submitted with two versions of the art on a single page. The larger version is for judging. The smaller version is to show what the actual pin will look like. The larger version must be 7" x 7". The smaller version should be approx. 1" x 1", Both versions should be identical.
