# PIN DESIGN (Virtual)

## **Contest Description**

This contest follows all National Standards & Guidelines.

Contestants are to submit their artwork for the pin design and give a 5-7 minute online presentation explaining how their design accurately represents the state and what qualities it possesses and why another SkillsUSA member would want to wear it.

## **Regional Competition**

The contest consists of two parts:

- Students will submit their Pin design and resume to SkillsUSA CA for judges to evaluate by January 9, 2021.
- 2. Judges will evaluate the designs and the top 6 students selected from each region (Regional Finalists) will be notified that they will be moving forward to the interview portion of the contest.
- 3. Regional Finalists will be scheduled for a 5-7 minute oral presentation and question-and-answer session (on **January 23, 2021**) over the zoom platform. All contestants will be asked 2-3 predetermined questions.
  - a. Please see the official SkillsUSA Virtual Pin Design Technical Standards for contest restrictions and requirements.
- The contestant schedule will be emailed to the advisor/contestants by Friday, December 11, 2020. Changes cannot be made to scheduled time slots.

# **Knowledge Performance**

There will be no skill-related written test.

- 2. Supporting materials for the interview portion of the contest
- 3. Rendering of Pin (All entries should be submitted with two versions of the art on a single page).

The larger version is for judging. The smaller version is to show what the actual pin will look like. The larger version must be approximately 7 inches wide x 7 inches high. The smaller version should be approximately 1-inch x 1 inch. Both versions should be identical.)
