Collision Damage Appraisal (Virtual)

Contest Description

The purpose of this competition is to evaluate each contestant's preparation for employment and to recognize outstanding students for excellence and professionalism in the field of collision damage appraisal and total loss evaluation. Open to active SkillsUSA members enrolled in programs with collision damage appraisal and total loss evaluation as an occupational objective. Students will complete an online contest/exam in lieu of an in-person competition.

Students will complete the exam electronically on February 6, 2021. The schedule and times will be emailed to the advisor/contestants by Friday, December 11, 2020. Changes cannot be made to scheduled time slots. Resumes must be submitted to SkillsUSA California by February 6, 2021 (details to follow).

Knowledge Performance

The contest includes a 50 to 100 question written knowledge test based on ASE standards, covering the areas of the Damage Analysis & Estimating that are identified in the NATEF Collision Repair/Refinishing Program Standards and the ASE Official Study Guide: Collision Repair/Refinish. The test may include the following elements:

- 1. Damage Analysis
- 2. Estimating
- 3. Legal & Environmental Practices
- 4. Vehicle Construction
- 5. Vehicle Systems Knowledge
- Parts & Source Identification
- 7. Customer Relations & Sales Skills
- 8. SkillsUSA Framework
